Message from District Leadership RRISD Superintendent of Schools

New. Year. Think about it, we can all do something about the "new" but nothing about the "year!" For each of us, it's 2020. So what's new with you? A resolution? A word? A relationship? A friend? My hope is that each has experienced a renewed start! And, if you haven't yet, I challenge you to do so by the end of this month. Grabbing hold of those who lift your spirit is a chance for an amazing renewal. So is releasing, or letting go, of those who may be keeping you from your best self. One is easier than the other, however, both might be necessary. A new year affords us the luxury of now, rather than someday. (Remember that Someday is not a day of the week!)

Each year at this time, I choose and share with others my "one word" for the year. The "one word" movement encourages us to select a word as a theme for the year, instead of setting a new year's resolution which is often about breaking a bad habit or changing a single behavior. Selecting a word to govern us day-to-day provides more of a focus on character and can permeate every action we take.

Literally, the word stretch means to "be made or be capable of being made longer or wider without tearing or breaking." As I work this year to stretch my body, I also want to find ways to expand my mind. How? By feeding it a steady diet of great literature, interesting nonfiction, and time for meditation. By seeking new adventures and discovering new places. I also want to stretch my capacity for helping others. For walking a mile in their shoes. For getting out of my comfort zone. The boundary hearings will begin at 6 p.m. at the following locations:

> England Elementary: Tuesday, January 21 Herrington Elementary: Wednesday, January 22 C.D. Fulkes Middle: Thursday, January 23 Caraway Elementary: Monday, January 27 Joe Lee Johnson Elementary: Tuesday, January 28

Message from District Leadership RRISD Board of Trustees

Happy 2020! I feel so very privileged to be elected President of the RRISD Board of Trustees this past December. I am excited to serve alongside Steve Math, as Vice President and Amber Feller, as Secretary.

The board has a very busy Spring ahead. The first major order of business is discussing boundaries. We have several schools facing severe overcrowding. Some overcrowding will be alleviated by the opening of elementary #35 for the 2021-22 school year. But other overcrowding issues require that we consider new boundaries. To that end, we will be having public forums in the coming weeks. The Board is aware that there are other areas and schools that need to be reviewed to ease overcrowding. I hope this will be the first round as we start to better utilize the facilities around the district. More information can be found

The board will also be working on safety and security for the district. Our current contracts for School Resource Officer (SRO) providers are coming to an end next school year. The board had requested that Williamson County take over all the SRO responsibilities for the district, but the Williamson County Commissioners declined to discuss or consider an extension of our contract with the Sheriff's office. The district is now pursuing our own options for safety and security based on the recommendations of the Safety Task Force. That presentation was September 9th and is online for review. https://roundrockisdtx.swagit.com/play/09092019-1013

The board is continuing to implement the Lone Star Governance recommendations and work with our TEA coach to improve student outcomes. We are excited to implement 2-way forums this Spring to promote better communication. Currently, the public and parents have limited ability to engage in a 2-way dialogue with the board, only emails or public testimony for 3 minutes at board meetings. Starting in 2020, the board and staff will have town hall style public meetings. These meetings will enable real 2-way, back and forth, dialogue between parents/public and the board/district staff. We are excited about this change and are hopeful that being able to dialogue with the community on our district goals and implementation strategies will improve outcomes for all our students.

Thank you to all the PTAs for your support and commitment to our students and community.

Stop the Bleed in Schools

As we watch the news every day, there always seems to be another mass casualty incident – another episode of violence in schools. But, did you know that your child is much more likely to sustain an injury completely unrelated to violence? Injuries are more likely to be caused by the accident on the playground, a broken arm or leg in sports, a child hit by a car while walking or biking to school, or a slip-up in woodshop, culinary arts, or automotive class. Regardless of the cause, the most common cause of death due to traumatic injuries is uncontrolled blood loss.

In the most severe injury with hemorrhage, it only takes a victim about 2-3 minutes to bleed out and significantly decrease their chances of survival. The average response time of EMS to arrive on scene is approximately 6-10 minutes, depending on location and whether the scene is safe for them to render aid to victims. It's easy to see the gap – EMS could potentially arrive on scene after a victim has already lost too much blood to save. BUT, what if bystanders were trained to provide life-saving skills and bridge the gap until EMS could get to the patient?

Bleeding control programs, like Stop the Bleed, teach laypeople how to apply tourniquets, pack wounds, perform direct pressure, and apply chest seals – all with the goal of saving lives until EMS can arrive and provide professional healthcare services.

Texas recently passed HB 496, which requires that every public school and public charter school create a Trauma Response Protocol, train staff, as well as students in 7th-12th grade, and install bleeding control stations with proper equipment. St. David's Healthcare and local EMS organizations have been working closely with school district health professionals to train them on this program. Everyone who completes the program will have the opportunity to practice these hands-on skills.

Are you Registered to Vote?

Election Day is coming up fast and the last day to register to vote in the March 3 Primary Election is Monday, February 3. Please make sure you are registered to vote!

The Texas Legislature isn't in session this year but Bills passed last year continue to come into effect. Part of House Bill 3 regarding the state's registry cataloging people who are not eligible to be hired by a Texas public school is now live. The 86th Texas Legislature passed House Bill 3 in order to "further protect the safety and welfare of Texas students." The registry, which is available to both public and private schools, will list individuals who are not eligible for hire in a Texas public school based on misconduct or criminal history. The bill also requires schools to report certain allegations of misconduct against non-certified employees. The registry will be available to schools at first, with public access coming in April from the Texas Education Agency. It's PTA Election Season Time

Schedule your membership meetings appropriately and nominate an Election Nominating Committee in compliance with your bylaws. Any



member of your PTA may be nominated and elected to this committee, excluding the current president.

No one automatically serves as a committee member or alternate because of their position or title, including the principal.

No person can serve on the nominating committee for two consecutive years.

Select a Chair: A chair is selected by the committee immediately following the Membership Meeting.

Nominating Committee Meeting: The meeting may be conducted if a majority of the committee is present. (If a committee member cannot attend the meeting, notify the alternate. If another committee meeting is called, that alternate member will continue to serve on the committee and the original member does not return.)

Responsibilities of Committee: Treat all candidates in a fair and consistent manner and make all decisions by ballot or majority vote. For questions about the process please email Jenn Griffith at Parliamentarian@rrisdpta.org



- As of early December, RRHS PTSA was the third largest PTA in the state of Texas. Wish us luck as we aim to be No. 1!




Stony Point HS PTSA





Treasurer Tips for the New Year

If one of your New Year's resolutions is to be better organized, I recommend you keep the Local PTA Roster bookmarked on your browser https://t.e2ma.net/click/amsuec/aeihntb/y4mptg. It's a one-stop-shop for your PTA's stats, from Standards of Continuing Affiliation to membership awards. Be sure to check your membership totals about a week after you submit your roster and dues to Texas PTA.

Does your PTA wish to be listed on JoinPTA.org in 2020? Check out the new JoinPTA.org FAQS page for answers to your many burning questions. For your PTA to be listed on JoinPTA.org, you must complete the secure ACH Authorization Agreement with Texas PTA. Treasurers are charged with completing this form.

Not sure if your PTA has submitted the ACH form? Visit the Local PTA Roster (column AT) to verify. A checkmark means your PTA will be listed on JoinPTA.org when the website comes back online. Keep in mind this report is updated manually after Texas PTA verifies it is correct and complete. It may take 7-10 business days after your submission to see a checkmark.

It's sales tax filing season for most PTAs. The annual (January-December) and 2019 4th quarter (October-December) sales tax returns are due on January 21, 2020, to the Texas State Comptroller if your PTA holds a sales and use tax permit. When the permit was issued, the PTA was assigned a reporting period. This could be annually, quarterly, or monthly. Texas PTA does not have this information on file. You will need to contact the Comptroller's Office directly if you do not know your filing period. If you hold a sales and use tax permit, you must file a return even if you had no taxable sales during the reporting period. The Texas State Comptroller's Office does charge a penalty for filing late. The BASICS Treasurer Resource Guide has additional information about completing the sales tax return.

Influx of Vaping Related Illness Prompts Official Naming

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has given a name to vaping-related illness: EVALI, which stands for e-cigarette or vaping product use-associated lung injury, according to new healthcare recommendations the agency released October 11, 2019.



Forty-nine states, the District of Columbia, and one U.S. territory have reported more than 1,299 cases of lung injury associated with the use of e-cigarettes or vaping products. As of October 11, 2019, 26 deaths have been reported from 21 states.

The CDC recommends individuals not use ecigarettes or vaping products -

- containing THC
- outside of their described labeled use
- if not already using
